Jesuits of the United States who have died in recent months

CALIFORNIA PROVINCE

Fr. Edward T. Burke, 87, on February 27 in Los Gatos, Calif. He was librarian at Sacred Heart Jesuit Center in Los Gatos for 30 years.

Fr. Donald F. Kolda, 88, on April 11 in Laguna Beach, Calif. He served at Jesuit parishes in Phoenix, San Diego, Santa Clara, Hollywood, Santa Barbara, and Santa Ana.

Fr. John D. McAnulty, 88, on April 4 in Los Gatos, Calif. He founded and directed the Cardinal Timothy Manning House of Prayer for Priests in Los Angeles.

Fr. Vernon J. Ruland, 77, on April 2 in Los Gatos, Calif. He taught theology at the Jesuit School of Theology in Chicago, the University of Detroit, and at the University of San Francisco for 35 years.

CHICAGO PROVINCE

Fr. Robert C. O'Connor, 82, on May 23 in Clarkston, Mich. He taught French, Latin, and theology at St. Xavier High and served at St. Xavier Parish in Cincinnati.

DETROIT PROVINCE
